

# Partnership Spotlight: UNO

Within 48 hours of emailing a flyer about the Christ Child Scholarship Program to a couple of advisors, Rachael Jensen, then Director of Youth Safety and Health Security, had 49 applications. Every application detailed tremendous financial need, and many shared very personal struggles.

In February 2022, Christ Child Society approved the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO) as a certified agency for the Scholarship Program. The agency promotes the Scholarship Program, seeks candidates, and assists with the application process. Once approved, it walks alongside the student, helping with their unique needs, and ensuring their success. The beauty of the partnership is that the certified agency finds eligible candidates and applies on their behalf while the Christ Child Society scholarship committee selects the awardees.

With such a tight deadline, Rachael was surprised at the enormous response to her flyer. Student responses to the scholarship poured in. Zoom calls were scheduled so Rachael could interview each candidate before submitting their application. Several students juggled the responsibilities of being pregnant and parenting, had multiple jobs, or made their way back to school once their kids were a little older. One overwhelmed young woman even came into Rachael's office and asked, "Would you help me process my life?"

In response to the newly identified need, UNO created the Office of Hardship and Resiliency Support (OHRS) and put Rachael in charge. This office not only supports the pregnant and parenting students at UNO but also supports students with lived foster care and justice experience, and students with incarcerated parents. In this first round, Christ Child awarded six \$5,000 renewable scholarships to current UNO student parents. Working together, UNO and Christ Child are helping students on the path to new beginnings and future stability. As Rachael says, "Education influences futures. We have an opportunity to help change the narrative, infuse hope, and encourage generational prosperity. And we do that together, as a community."

### Hand-Sewn Hugs

Since its inception, the one constant of Christ Child Omaha has been providing layettes for unwed mothers and their newborn babies. Over the years, the contents of the layette has evolved with one exception: a hand-sewn flannel blanket.

edicated members of two auxiliaries sew these flannel blankets: Ses Enfants in Omaha and Ses Amies in Fordyce. To create 2000 blankets needed for the layettes each year, the auxiliaries seek help from volunteer seamstresses. A team of new Christ Child fans has been recruited to assist. In July, Christ Child teamed up with the Fashion Arts Collective (FAC) to sew blankets. During a one-night blitz, over 25 volunteers gathered at Midtown's Empire Room and, using the sewing machines set up for FAC, created over 200 blankets. It was so successful, plans are underway



The flannel used is paid for by generous donors and purchased using a new bulk pricing contract. Each layette blanket is made from the softest of flannel fabrics, tied with love, and folded into the layette along with other necessities a newborn needs during its first days in this wonderful world. The hand-sewn blankets represent a loving hug from the Christ Child himself for the newborn baby!

#### MARY VIRGINIA MERRICK DAY AT DUCHESNE



Eighty Duchesne Academy seniors gathered on a beautiful fall day for the "Mary Virginia Merrick Day of Service." Inspired by the founder of the Christ Child Society, the students and some pint-sized Duchesne preschoolers shared the hands-on project of filling 500 backpacks with baby essentials which were delivered to 30 agencies across Omaha, Council Bluffs and Lincoln. The agencies will give them to new mothers in need of these vital newborn necessities. Watching the students in swift action proved that "many hands make light work!"

In August, we partnered with the Heart Ministry Center to surprise 20 new and expectant mothers with a grow-with-me car seat. The mothers attended a car seat safety and installation class taught by a specialist from Children's Hospital. Following the class, the expectant moms beamed with delight upon learning they each would receive a brand new car seat to safely travel with their newborn baby!

This fall, the car seat program also traveled to Lincoln and delivered car seats to the Women's Care Center. In December, members of Christ Child's Les Anges auxiliary will return to the Heart Ministry Center to host a "Holiday Car Seat Giveaway."

The Car Seat program assists under-resourced mothers for whom a quality car seat is simply unaffordable. We are thankful to our generous donors for supporting this vital program!
